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Nordic Strengths in the Health Area

The Nordic countries share synergistic factors that make the region attractive for research and innovation:

- o similar health care systems available to all citizens
- publicly funded universities
- established research networks
- o citizens have trust in research and authorities collecting data
- population of +27 Million

Long history of Nordic cooperation between scientists and political stakeholders



Health Data – a Nordic Goldmine

- Each Nordic country have similar health data sources collected by health care, authorities, research and patients/individuals
- Register-, biobank-, genomics-, survey data
- The personal identification number allows linkage
- Data "from the cradle to the grave"



Health and Welfare: a Nordic research priority

- NordForsk Nordic institution that funds research and research infrastructure cooperation
- Major investments in health research (MEUR 50+)
- Co-funded by all Nordic countries
- Focus on exploiting the Nordic strategic data resources registers and biobanks in research
- Data acquisition processes are time-consuming, includes many permits and issues of comparability








A Nordic Political Priority

- An NCM report shed light on challenges impeding Nordic register data utilization already in 2012
- The Könberg report proposed a Nordic virtual center for register-based research in 2014
- 2017 and 2022: the Norwegian Presidency puts focus on Nordic cooperation on health data
- The Nordic Council of Ministers Vision 2030 the Nordic Commons included in the Action Plan 2021-2024.








How to Reach the Nordic Potential?

- NordForsk coordinated a Nordic effort to identify ways of improving secondary use of health data in research
- Funding from the Norwegian Presidency Programme
 2017-2019
- Task Forces on metadata, technology and legislation/ethics
- Recommendations were presented to EK-S, EK-U and Nordic Research Funders in 2020





Vision for the Nordic Commons

"The Nordic region as a leading region for secondary use of health data"

This would require:

- Nordic health data described with rich metadata according to the FAIR* criteria –a federated Nordic Health Metadata Repository
- A Nordic federated secure infrastructure for processing sensitive personal data
- 3. A coherent legal and ethical framework supporting the above
- 4. A funding programme for technology and competence development (proof-of-value)





Recommendations


- A. To establish a **high-level policy board** comprised of national actors from the health, research and innovation sectors.
 - ☐ aligning national initiatives
 - access to resources
 - promote funding mechanisms and calls
 - □ support of development, proof-of-value projects
 - ☐ establish future governance

- B. To secure **sustainable funding** from national and Nordic research/innovation and research infrastructure funders.
 - support research to test, utilise and contribute to the Nordic Health Data technology solution and to the Nordic metadata standards framework.



Recommendations (continued)

C. To establish a **technology expert group** comprised of national representatives of digital infrastructures on health data.



- outlining the design and implementation of a Nordic Health Cloud
- ☐ setting up use-cases/proof of values

D. To establish a **metadata expert group** comprised of the national health data hosting organisations and relevant national metadata initiatives.

- set up a Nordic health metadata repository ecosystem
- i.e. a digitalised system for data documentation using established standards.


E. To establish an **expert group on legislation**, **ethics and trust** comprised of competencies in and perspectives on international legislation and policies.

□ national legislation should meet the technology demands of the Nordic Health Cloud.



The project has been kicked-off

- The Nordic Commons Project has been funded with appr. MEUR 3 (22 MDKK) between 2021-2024
- NordForsk tasked to provide administrative support to Policy Board and coordinating function
- Norway and Finland Lead countries
- Mandate for Policy Board, Executive Team and NordForsk decided by EK-S (Nordic Committee of Senior Officials from Health Ministries)
- Nordic countries have appointed members to Policy Board and Executive Team. Chair appointed early February. Policy Board met in March. Task Forces nominated.
